We are kicking off our spring season for our competitive programs and recreational leagues. Schedules are set, the first few weeks of practice are behind us, and the children are ready for play. We want this to be the best season yet, and we control our attitude as we set forth on the journey.

At the end of February, we hosted our Rush Union Spring Cup. We had over 175 teams, playing over 6 venues, including 37 divisions. This equated to almost 300 games played and over 2500 players. This was our third annual Spring Cup and was our largest to date. We would like to congratulate all of the teams for a great tournament and the eleven Rush Union teams who made the finals, six of which were crowned champions. In addition to the Rush Cup tournament success, we had various other tournament successes during February. We had teams participating in the Lanier Shootout, SSA Spring Classic, RYSA Spring Kickoff, Steamers Spring Classic, Concorde Challenge Cup, and the Knoxville Spring Kickoff. During the last month our coaching staff has been working hard to prepare for the upcoming season. We held two USSF Grassroot licenses, one in Milton and one in Dunwoody. In addition to this we held age group and program meetings to discuss best systems for practice organization and structure. We are taking advantage of tools provided to us by Rush National through The Coaching Manual platform that provides our coaches access to a comprehensive curriculum and lesson plans. We hope you see this translating to the field this spring season as our coaches continue to strive to be the best that they can be. We held program orientation meetings throughout February and into early March for anyone that wants to learn more on these initiatives.

As part of the Positively Soccer Program offered by Georgia Soccer, we held two more Jr Referee classes with nearly 40 new Jr Referees participating. We want to emphasize one of the most important elements of referee development is parent and coach behavior on the sidelines. This is a new season, and we encourage everyone to have a new focus on supporting all participants of the game, including the referees. 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Planning for the summer has been ongoing, and there will be a large variety for summer programs available during June and July. 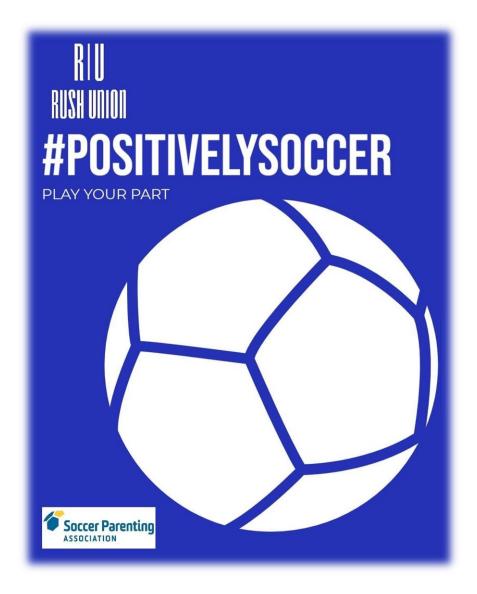
